

## DUAL ENROLLMENT

Juniors and seniors may elect to take a college class during the school day upon meeting the following requirements:

1. Student must have earned the following scores: **ACT –Math, English & Reading: 18 or higher; PLAN –Writing/English (21 or higher), Math (18 or higher), Reading (17 or higher); PSAT – Critical Reading (44 or higher), Math (45 or higher), English/Writing (49 or higher); SAT – Math (416 or higher), Critical Thinking (430 or higher).** Jackson Community College also asks that you pass their placement tests.
2. Student must have earned sufficient credits so he/she has achieved 12<sup>th</sup> grade status.
3. Student must be enrolled in the district and post-secondary institution during the district's regular academic year.
4. Student must meet graduation requirements in the high school academic department in which they are taking the college course.
5. Student must select a course that is not available at the local high school, unless there is a conflict.
6. Permission must be granted by Camden-Frontier administration.

If a student meets the dual enrollment eligibility, the home school district shall pay tuition and fees for the academic course. If the student chooses to drop a dual enrollment course, they will be responsible for notifying the post-secondary institution and meeting with the home school counselor to adjust their academic schedule. Should the student fail the college course, the student/parent is required to reimburse Camden Frontier Schools for the cost of the class, fees, books, etc.

## ON-LINE COURSES

Students may elect to take an on-line class during the school day upon meeting the following requirements:

1. Students must have exhausted all opportunities to participate in existing programs of instruction (i.e., there must be no classes available that they MAY take).
2. Students must select a course that is not available at the local high school.
3. The course selected must meet the requirements of the student's Educational Development Plan (EDP).

NOTES: \* Flex 90 courses are designed to be completed in 90 days (1 semester).

No student may take more than two (2) on-line courses during the school year. If a student meets the enrollment eligibility, the home school district shall pay tuition and fees for the academic course. If the student chooses to drop the on-line course, they will be responsible for notifying the counselor to adjust their academic schedule. **If the student fails the course or drops the course after the withdrawal date, the student is required to pay Camden-Frontier for that course.**

### ITV COURSES

Two way or interactive classes are being offered by schools within Hillsdale County and may be available for individuals or small groups of students. Schedules for these courses and prerequisites are at the discretion of the providing school district. Classes will only be offered if there are enough students signed up for the course. It is the intention of the ISD to offer classes in the morning and afternoon. The ITV programs that are being offered for school year 2007-2008 are as follows:

### ACADEMIC PLACEMENT CLASSES

These classes represent placement classes. Students would participate in a field of study through placement in community businesses and educational learning environments. They would also participate in monthly learning seminars. Enrollment will be determined by slots and must be EDP (Educational Development Plan) generated. **Transportation to off campus activities must be provided by the student.**

### ADDING AND DROPPING COURSES

Students may elect to add or drop a program of instruction after the first semester has started. **Any changes of schedule must be accomplished within the first week of school** in order to insure that a student is placed in a different program. This policy allows students to make the switch between programs without significant impact on academic performance. Students will be scheduled for seven courses. For any course that is dropped, another course must be added.
